SIYC Fleet Captain Report

The recent warm weather has officially started the 2024 boating season. Many boaters have started working on their sail and power boats for another boating season. SIYC slips are filling up with member boats and we have already seen some transient boats visiting the Club. In fact, we are already ahead of last year with transient reservations! More are expected from reciprocating yacht clubs and other approved organizations as the year progresses. We had some unfortunate breaks in the water lines to the piers. The water has been turned on to the main pier, but not to the Redfield pier. The pier committee is working on getting them repaired.

We have a number of cruises scheduled and encourage all active boaters to sign up. Butch Garren is leading the effort to organize cruises for members' sailboats. The first sailboat raft-up of the season will take place at noon on May 11, 2024 in Cuckhold Creek. A second cruise for all boaters will be on May 25, 2024 to the Wicomico Yacht Club opening day, led by Bruce Dickerson. Please sign up or contact Butch or Bruce if you are interested.

Plans are underway for the annual Blessing of the Fleet organized by SIYC. This year's event will take place between 1 and 3 p.m. on Sunday, May 19, 2024. All boaters are welcome to participate. Further information will be forthcoming later.

Celebrating Women of the Sea

Ted and I recently returned from a Caribbean Cruise with Bernice and Dennis Lawson aboard the Celebrity Beyond. When we first scheduled the cruise, Bernice and Dennis told us we were in for a treat as "the Beyond" was captained by the first American woman cruise ship Captain, Kate McCue. I did not think much about it at the time, but when we boarded the Beyond, and experienced the command of Captain Kate and the efficiency and atmosphere of her ship, I felt so pleased and proud. From talking to the crew, you could see how much she was respected and her dedication to bringing more women into command of these vessels was admired and commended. The cruise we were on had about 70 percent women officers being mentored for Captain, and Captain Kate told me a previous cruise had all women officers. This is something I could not have imagined growing up. I was so pleased. It brought joy to my heart, and I told Captain Kate as much when she greeted us all as we disembarked. I am not much on selfies, but I took one with Captain Kate to remember. (Note: She has a great sense of humor too that was always on display – as an example, her name badge says "Captain – Please don't call it a boat.")

On returning home, I read the story of Sailor Cole Brauer who made history as the first woman to race solo around the world. At the young age of 29, she placed second out of 16 sailors who competed in the Global Solo Challenge, more than half of whom dropped out. For her next feat, she intends to compete in the Vendee Globe, a single-handed, non-stop, non-assisted round the world sailing race in 2028. Another amazing woman of the sea.

These accomplished women have me thinking about all the accomplished women of the sea we have in SIYC. In the Captain ranks, there is Margie Dove, Sue Stevenson and Donna Fabian. (My apologies if there are other Captains out there. Please let me know.) Margie did charters for years, Sue Stevenson did a solo trip down the Intercoastal Waterway, and Donna Fabian regularly captains her vessel around the Bay. Then there are the first mates who do everything on the boats, not the least of which is ensuring successful docking! Many race with their spouses on vessels, including our Commodore Barbara Raley, who did many a sailing race with her husband Clarke, including the renowned Governor's Cup Race.

So, here's to all the women of the sea, near and far. You are strong, you are skillful, and you set an enduring example for all young women and for us all.
