## Visit The Maryland Dove at SIYC

The Maryland Dove will stay overnight at the SIYC dock for two different Wednesday dates: Sept. 5 and 12. During those evenings approximately $5-7 \mathrm{pm}$, the ship's crew will host free topside tours for SIYC members and their guests.

SIYC will host the ship on her way to and from Cambridge and Oxford on Maryland's Eastern Shore on the Choptank River. The purpose of the ship in general, and this trip especially, is to educate visitors about 17th-century Maryland life and transportation --the time when St. Mary's City was the capital of the new colony. The Maryland Dove is normally exhibited at Historic St. Mary's City, the living history museum of Maryland's first capital, but occasionally travels for educational programs. The ship was built 40 years ago (launched in 1978) outside Cambridge.
