## Fleet Surgeon's Corner

#### Stayin' Alive, Stayin' Alive

It is so important to know CPR and it is one of the few medical interventions that anyone can learn how to do. (Though training is always a good idea.)

54%: proportion of Americans who say they know CPR according to a a 2017 survey.

11%: proportion who know the correct rhythm for the chest compressions.

Two: minutes within which a rescuer has to start CPR to protect a person's brain from injury.

CPR: A Quick How To

Say a person collapses in front of you.

First, check if the person is breathing normally or is responsive. (Asking "Are you okay?" is a good way.)

If they aren't, and you are not trained in CPR , do 2 things:

Call 911 and do chest compressions.

Place the heel of your bottom hand in the center of a person's chest. Press hard and at a rate of about 100-120 beats per minute, with a few quick breaks, as needed, until EMS arrives.

Most CPR instructors suggest singing the Bee Gee's "Stayin Alive" in your head. That will put you at about the right tempo.

If you are trained, there is more you can do, like tilting the person 's head back to open the airway and giving two mouth-to-mouth breaths for every 30 chest compressions. But, if you are not sure, best not to risk it. Call 911, or send someone to call 911, and start chest compressions!

#### Commodore Mike Snapp presented a donation from Solomons Island Yacht Club members to Sally Hamilton, Manager of SMILE Ecumenical Ministries, on January 4, 2019 in thanks for SMILE's support to the Calvert community.

In a tradition started in 2003 by Past Commodore Tom Sidleck and the late Joan Kocen, many members of Solomons Island Yacht Club have included donations to Calvert's SMILE Ecumenical Ministries in their holiday greetings to the club and each other. For 2018, club members donated a new high of \$2,410 to SMILE in thanks for the food bank and other help that SMILE provides to its southern Calvert neighbors.


SMILE is an independent, nonprofit organization that was organized in summer of 1991 when a group of clergy and lay persons from seven religious congregations in Lusby and Solomons met to address the issues of those in need in Southern Calvert County, specifically those living south of Broomes Island Road. The group chose SMILE for its name and the acronym stands for **S**ervice **M**akes Individual Lives Exciting.

In 2018, the total number of people fed by the SMILE Food Pantry was 28,198. This was an average of approximately 200 families each week, which is about 570 people. Of this number, approximately 41% are 18 and under, 39% are 19-54, and 20% are 55+. Of the adults, 5% were veterans.

The clients are given a weekly bag based on family size, a loaf of bread, breakfast cereal and frozen meat (about 1/2 lb per person in the family). The bags contain items such as tuna, spaghetti sauce, pasta, soups, baked beans, canned vegetables, ravioli, macaroni and cheese, rice and fruit. Snacks are provided as available. This could be considered enough food for about 8 meals. Other miscellaneous food items may be requested, such as peanut butter and jelly. The majority of SMILE'S food purchases come from the Maryland Food Bank. Additionally, SMILE is blessed with generous donations from the community.

In November, SMILE provided 319 turkeys and boxes of fixings to 279 families, feeding 954 people for Thanksgiving. In August, SMILE distributed 300 backpacks to deserving children. These packs were stuffed with needed school supplies based on age from Pre-K to High School, such as notebooks, paper, pencils, pens, rulers, crayons and scissors.








