Stayin' Alive Stayin' Alive

CPR: A Quick How To Review:

Say a person collapses in front of you.

First, check if the person is breathing normally or is responsive. (Asking "Are you okay" is a good way.)

If they aren't, and you are not trained in CPR, do 2 things:

Call 911 and do chest compressions.

Place the heel of your bottom hand in the center of a person's chest. Press hard and fast at a rate of about 100-120 beats per minute, with a few breaks, as needed, until EMS arrives.

Cardiac arrest is not a heart attack, it is worse. It means that the heart stops beating, it's electrical activity is knocked out. CPR can buy critical time. So, now the Third thing you can do:

GET THE AED.

Open the AED, turn it on, attach the adult pad to the person's chest. The AED will guide you from there with voice commands. It will say things like:

"Stand back, evaluating heart rhythm."

"Shock advised, stand back."

"No shock needed, continue CPR."
