

BITS n' BYTES

As irritating as Robocalls are, there are even worse dangers lurking out there via actual voice calls and emails. These are scams designed to trick you into believing you are due a refund from a computer support company, or you owe something to a credit card company, or you owe back taxes, or someone needs your social security number. The motive is to gain remote access of your computer or have you reveal information in order to steal your personal data, identity, and money.

Here are some things you can do to avoid becoming a victim of these scams:

Hang up on unexpected calls from anyone who claims to be tech support, IRS, Microsoft, Apple, etc.

Do not return voice messages from anyone who claims to be from these agencies or companies.

Never give control of your computer or share passwords or personal information with anyone you do not know. Know that these agencies or companies will not make unsolicited phone calls or send emails to help you with your computer or finances.

Visit The Maryland Dove at SIYC

The Maryland Dove will stay overnight at the SIYC dock June 26 and again on July 2nd. SIYC will host the ship on her way to St.



Michaels where they are celebrating the start of the New Dove Construction. The purpose of the ship is to educate visitors about 17th-century Maryland life and transportation --the time when St. Mary's City was the capital of

the new colony. The Maryland Dove is normally exhibited at Historic St. Mary's City, the living history museum of Maryland's first capital, but occasionally travels for educational programs. The ship was built 41 years ago (launched in 1978) outside of Cambridge on Maryland's Eastern Shore. SIYC members and their guests are invited to visit the Maryland Dove at SIYC on Wednesday, June 26. From approximately 5 to 7 pm, the ship's crew will host free topside tours while at the Yacht Club dock. The ship will dock again on the July 2 return trip, but there will not be tours of the ship on that day as most crew return home after docking.


