Please join me in thanking these volunteers who worked tirelessly to give us these two delicious dinners. Also thanks to the members of Susan Smith's Social Committee who planned and implemented a fun filled weekend.

In September, meals will be offered on Wednesday nights, but there will be no official dinner on Saturday, September 21 because of a hall rental that day, and September 28 due to the Poker Run. However, there are two meals free to members: September 7, the Annual Commodore's Party which is a Crab Fest this year,

and the September 14 Annual Membership meeting dinner. Menus for both meals are listed in the paragraph below.

There are five sign up meals in September. 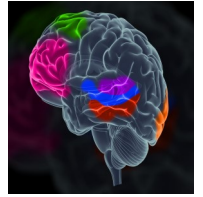

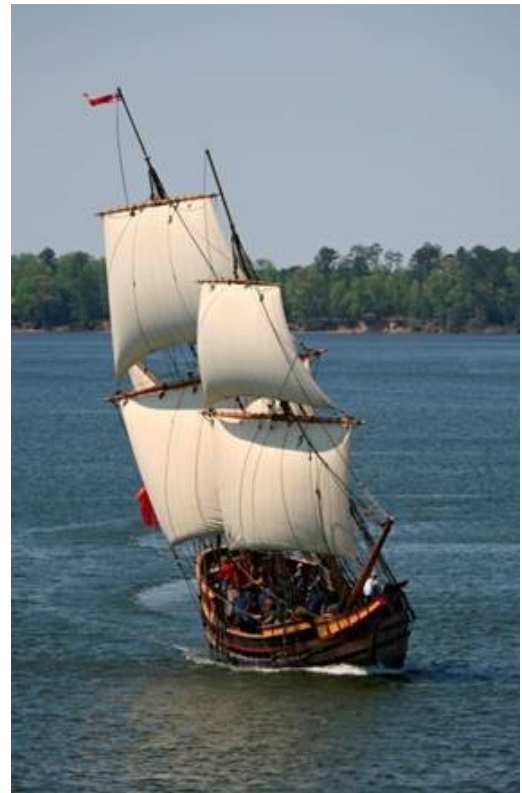

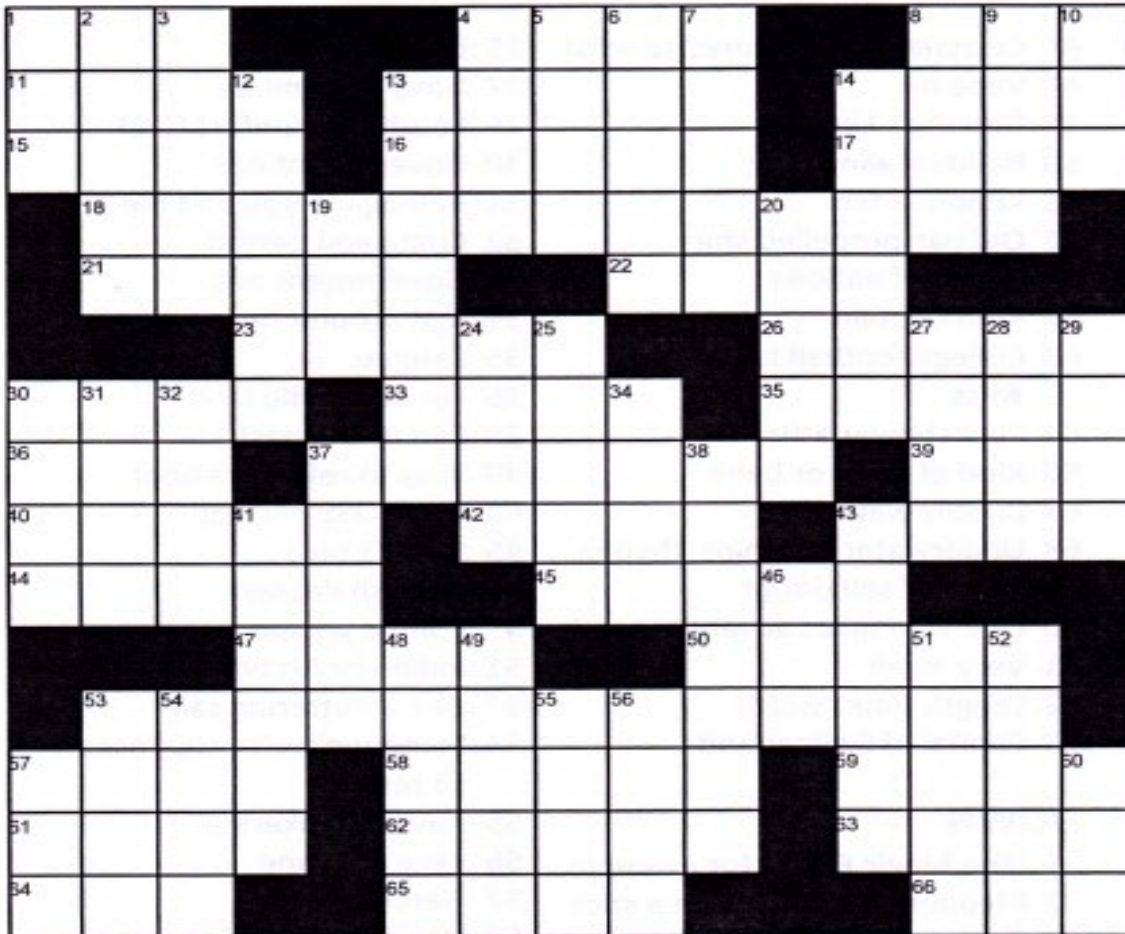
