Answer: The *Pandora*. A brig or jail called "Pandora's Box" was built on the aft section of the quarterdeck to hold the mutineers. While searching the entire area, the ship hit a reef and went down without locating the Pitcairn Island hideaway of the missing mutineers. It wasn't until 1808 that an American sailing vessel, the *Topaz*, accidentally discovered the mutineer's refuge. By that time, only one of the men was still alive, but they had left many descendants.
