Thoughts On The Corona Virus Vaccine

I have heard more negative comments in reference to getting the vaccine when it is available than positive. So, I wanted to share some of my thoughts and information on the vaccine for Covid-19.

We have years of vaccine experience in the US. We also have a familiarity with the SARS Corona Virus. A recent Gallup Poll showed 65% of Americans said they would take a vaccine, but 35% said they would not, even if it were free and approved by the FDA. Deciding on the first vaccine will be especially difficult if the data isn't clear, and shows minimal efficacy and side effects.

The FDA Commissioner, Stephen Hahn, said in a statement that Peter Marks, the Director of Biologies and Research, is over-seeing and scrutinizing every bit of data and vaccine candidates. His scientists will "call the balls and strikes" on a vaccine and will not cut corners. "There are no circumstances under which the FDA would allow a vaccine to be released for use by the public if it has not shown to be safe," Hahn said.

The pandemic will end only when enough people are protected against the corona virus, whether by vaccine or by already being infected. Reaching this threshold doesn't mean that the virus will disappear but with fewer hosts to infect, it will make its way through a community much more slowly. Herd immunity may be reached at 45%-50% instead of the 70% previously thought by many scientists.

We will await the data on the vaccine. It will probably not be available to us until early in 2021. Until then, continue our proven practices of hand washing, social distancing, and the most effective, according to the data, mask wearing.






Editor's Corner

KNOW THE ROPES

If sailors aboard a sailing ship did not know all the functions of the hundreds of ropes that made up the rigging; and, were not experts at dozens of knots, their ship could neither catch another vessel nor escape from superior forces. The rigging could comprise more than 10 miles (16 km) of ropes and cordage in the largest vessels, and the individual ropes had hundreds of different names and functions. The ropes were usually the same thickness and color, and so could only be told apart from the precise position in which they were secured.
